THE MYPT PROMISES

ATTENDANCE

Regular attendance is obviously vital, both for each cast member to develop personally and for the cast as a whole to be able to work together. Only 2 unexcused absences are allowed, and any absences in excess of 6 will require special permission. Notice of an absence should be given at least a week in advance except in case of illness or emergency.

The Promise

For the cast member

To attend regularly.

To notify MYPT staff in advance of any absence.

To sign up early for vacation time.

For MYPT staff

To conduct rehearsals as scheduled.

To give adequate notice of schedule changes.

To be flexible in working around reasonable absences of cast members.

For parents

To recognize their cast member's commitment to participate.

To support their cast member's regular attendance at rehearsals.

To try to firm up vacation time and make sure their cast member lets MYPT know early as possible.

TIMELINESS & ATTENTION

Even with two rehearsals a week, time is short for everything that must be covered. It is important that rehearsals start on time and that everyone gives full attention during rehearsals to make the most of the rehearsal time.

The Promise

For cast members

To be seated, with score in hand, ready for warm-up at the scheduled start time.

To pay attention to directions.

To socialize before or after rehearsal, not during it.

To leave the hall promptly when rehearsal is over (unless waiting for pick-up).

For MYPT staff

To start warm-ups promptly at the scheduled start time.

To give attention to the needs of principals, ensembles and chorus.

To try to limit "down time" for some parts of the cast while working with others.

To end rehearsals on time and remain at the hall until all cast members have left.

For parents

To deliver cast members to rehearsal on time.

To support cast members in being on time if they are old enough to transport themselves.

To pick up cast members on time.

PLEASE NOTE: *Parents are welcome to watch rehearsals quietly, but will be expected to observe distancing and mask requirements that may be in place for cast members, depending on public health guidance.*

CONDUCT

The object is not just to learn the show, but to have fun and enjoy doing it. But, the show can only be learned and performed well if everyone shows to each other attention, courtesy and respect.

The Promise

For cast members

To remain quiet while others are rehearsing.

To follow the directions of the MYPT staff on both artistic and administrative matters.

To give one's best effort at all times, and to give positive support to other cast members in their efforts.

To avoid inappropriate behavior or language.

For MYPT staff

To maintain a professional and respectful attitude.

To listen to suggestions and respond to questions.

To enforce rules of conduct so as to keep rehearsals orderly and productive.

To enforce rules of conduct fairly and even-handedly.

To respect and encourage each cast member's personal efforts.

For parents

To understand the need for order in managing a large cast.

To support the MYPT staff in maintaining proper conduct.

To understand that, if needed, a "time out place" may be used or parents may be called to pick up a cast member.

Repeated or very serious misconduct may result in exclusion from rehearsals or from the current or future performances.

Special Notes for 2026

For most of June, rehearsal times are Thursdays, 6:30 p.m. - 8:30 p.m., and Saturdays, 9:00 a.m. - 11:00 a.m. The first rehearsal is on Saturday, June 13. Starting June 25 and for the rest of the summer, rehearsal times may be extended up to an additional hour each day. Typically, only cast members with principal roles need to attend rehearsal for the additional hour through July. The directors may, however, on occasion request some or all of the chorus members to stay for some part of the additional hour. Many or all chorus members may be asked to stay all three hours in mid- to late August approaching the performance dates. Scheduling additional rehearsal times or days is not usually needed, although this could occur if the directors find it to be necessary.

The schedule for the technical / dress rehearsals and performances is:

Wednesday, Sept. 9, at 6:00 pm – Tech or Dress Rehearsal (Mandatory! No excuses allowed!)
Thursday, Sept. 10, at 6:00 pm – Final Dress Rehearsal (Mandatory! No excuses allowed!)
Friday, Sept. 11, at 7:00 pm – Performance
Saturday, Sept. 12, at 7:00 pm – Performance
Sunday, Sept. 13, at 3:00 pm – Performance

Please note that the tech/dress rehearsals may run late. We appreciate the cooperation of cast members and families.

Depending on cast size and ability to double cast principal roles, a matinee performance may be added at 2:00 pm on Saturday, Sept. 12.
